John Henry also directed the feature film *Ordinary Sinner*, which won Best Feature and Best Director at the Slamdunk Film Festival and the Audience Choice Award at the Greenwich film festival. The film was released theatrically and premiered on the Logo channel.

He has been a director and producer of many documentaries, including *Medicine as a Relational Act, The Making of Golden Gate, Healthy Families New York,* and *The Map: Exploring Transfer*. He directed and produced *Broken* 

*Mirrors*, a documentary about Jewish Identity, distributed by Seven Arts Releasing.

John Henry's distinguished teaching career spans being a full-time Professor at La Guardia Community College to working as a visiting professor at Vassar and NYU. He is presently teaching at UCLA Extension in the Writing and Entertainment Divisions.
